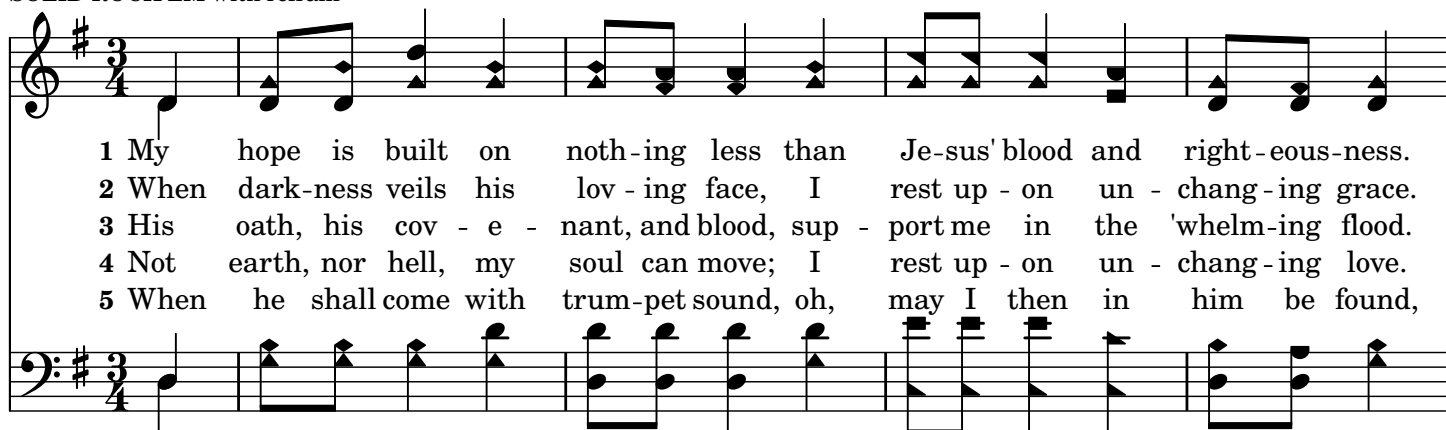


My hope is built on nothing less

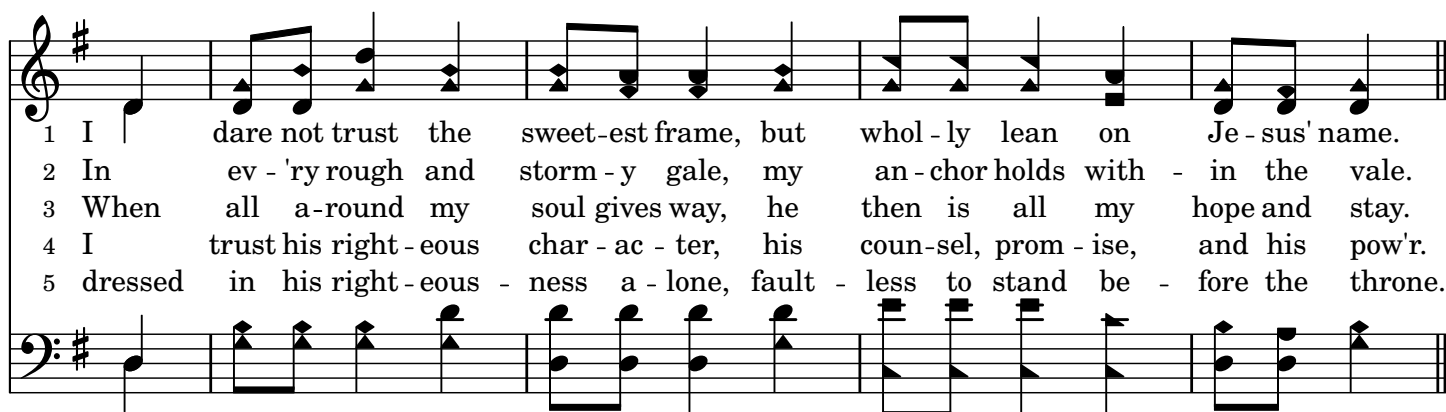

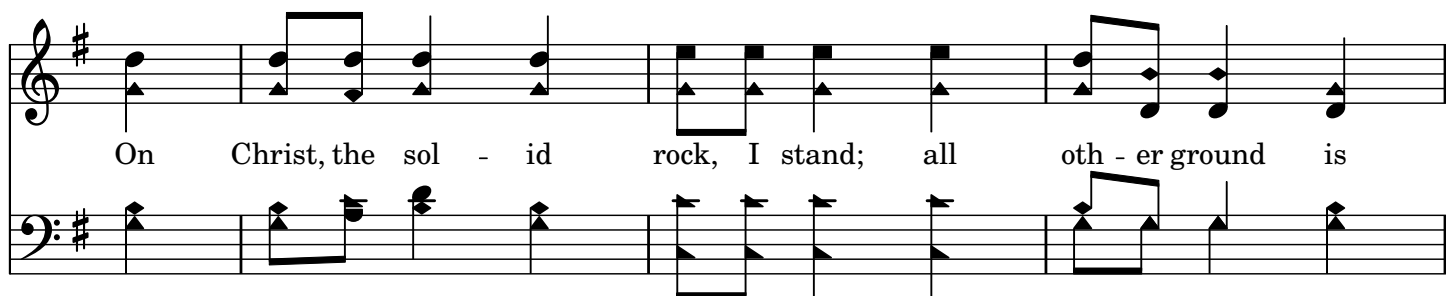

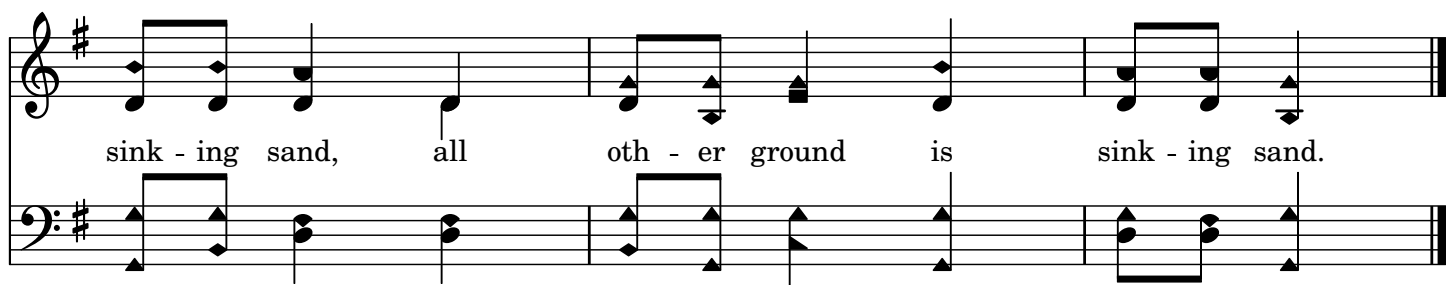
1 My hope is built on noth-ing less than Je-sus' blood and right-eous-ness.
